Welcome to the 2017 North Suburban Pond & Garden Walk; a self-guided walk open to all. You can **visit the yards in any order you want**, just **note which yards are open one day only**. If you have visited our yards before, we look forward to seeing you, your family, and friends again. The walk is free, but in lieu of a fee we take donations at any of the locations for two wonderful nature-loving charities: *Pollinator Partnership*, and *Wetlands Initiative*, both rated very high by Charity Navigator. ### 1. 235 Greenwood Road, Glenview

**Esther & Ken**

Garden style: A little wild-like nature, a little controlled, and a little whimsy. Our yard has wildflowers, perennials, roses, annuals, veggies, a raspberry patch, 3 ponds, and an arbor with a deck that Ken made. "Gump" the tortoise, manipulates a lot of what happens in our yard since he can eat an entire flower bed in a matter of minutes, therefore we do a fair amount of gardening in pots. Our largest pond was built for turtles, a few I've had since a kid. We now "rescue" unwanted pet turtles and tortoises. Last year we had a baby turtle born April 15, named Kenny, this year we had 3 baby turtles born April 15 and 16, Ross, Rizzo, and Benny. Get close up, perhaps hold a turtle, and see how big "Gump" is now. **No parking in driveway. Park on the shoulder of Greenwood - best on west side, or on side streets 1/4 block north or south.**

We invite you to visit our beautiful backyard oasis. Our pond is home to some friendly comets and koi, always ready to be hand fed! If you're lucky, you can watch Bert hand feed the frog. Return in the evening to see the magical transition to night enchantment. **Open both days, but open late til 9 PM for night lights viewing on Saturday only.**

A 2000-gallon sediment pond that waterfalls into an 8000-gallon pond, with about 40 koi. Landscaped, and check out the new butterfly garden. **Use our driveway or the street - DO NOT BLOCK neighbors' driveways.**

I started my garden here in Glenview in 2003. I have a very large hosta collection and shade garden. Check out the unique miniature hostas 'Munchkin Fire' and 'Curly Fries' and the majestic 'Aureomarginata' hosta. Enjoy the rose garden and my extensive perennial garden. **Enter garden through the south gate and exit through the north gate.**

### 6. 2827 Knollwood Lane, Glenview

Our garden has evolved over its 23 years to become mostly low maintenance native perennials. I raise Monarchs by pulling the baby Milkweed that grows in the lawn before its mowed. The females prefer to lay eggs on the new growth instead of the many 6+ feet plants in the back flower bed! I also have several varieties of Swamp Milkweed, other nectar and pollinator loving flowers. We have 4 rain barrels on each side of the house with soaker hoses attached that run through a Hosta garden in front and 3 raised beds (for veggies and berries) on the west side. Three tiny ponds with a waterfall and fountain appear to look like one larger pond. Tropicals, annuals, and even some fairies, can be found in many containers and hanging baskets. We have a homemade fenced vegetable garden which has been taken over by raspberries, but we do have an area for tomatoes and peppers. In order to maintain a garden of this size John has developed a water retention system off of the house into 5 55-gallon rain barrels.

We have a 1300-gallon pond with a waterfall and an island fountain geyser, started in 1992. The pond has about 70 fish, including koi, butterfly koi, goldfish, and several frogs. Across a small bridge and arbor you can view a small bog garden pond. Continue up the little hill and you can get a good view of Lake Arlington. We also have four fountains in the front and back yards that are lit up for night lighting along with the pond lights. Ask about the Mikis, and look for Reno, the Sun Conure Parrot.

Lake Arlington is in back of our house, restrooms and refreshments will be available there.

Open both days, but open late til 9 PM for night lights viewing on **Saturday** only.

Please DO NOT ENTER GATE until someone lets you in. Small dogs will run off. Thanks!


## 20. 734 Windsor Road, Glenview

Note: Bathrooms are not available at houses.


